General FAQ

Where?

The festival and all festival camping is on Camp St. Croix's North Property (532, County Rd F, Hudson, WI 54016).

When?

Gates open, and games and activities start, at noon on Saturday, September 17th. The last music set will begin at 9:00pm.

All non-campers will be asked to leave camp property following Saturday's final music set.

Lineup?

Rain?

Prairie Burn will go on, rain or shine.

Parking?

Parking is on site, and it is free. You can park overnight though camp is not responsible for your car or lost or stolen items.

Activities?

Camp is a very, very fun place. From noon through sun down we'll have activities like a scavenger hunt, our giant swing, the climbing tower, and hay rides all rolling.

All activities are free once inside so come ready to explore.

An app?

Yup, Prairie Burn has a guidebook app so you don't miss anything . Download it for free from the iTunes or Google Play store.

Cameras and recording devices?

Heck yes you can. Share along with us at #prairieburn.

Prohibited items?

No outside food or beverage (except water) is allowed in the festival's concert areas.

No coolers or large bags, illegal drugs of any sort, weapons, fireworks, or pets (service dogs are okay).

Seating and chairs?

The concerts are outside and guests sit or stand on a mowed lawn. You may bring your own chairs or blankets if you'd like.

Disability accommodations?

Yes. Disabled guests are provided with parking spaces close to the event entrance and we have handicap accessible portable toilets. Still, terrain can be uneven so please come prepared.

Lost and found?

Yes. There will be a lost and found station but camp is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

Wristbands and re-entry?

Guests will be given a wrist band upon arrival and can leave and re-enter if desired.

Electricity and WiFi?

Electricity will not be available but a festival guest WiFi network will be.

Merchandise?

Yes. We will have camp apparel, artist merchandise, and wares from several outdoor/camp focused vendors available for purchase. All proceeds support camp scholarship endowments.

2016 Prairie Burn Music Festival Camping FAQ

Family-friendly camping?

YES! All camping, whether in our family sites on the bluff or in our general camping area are explicitly family focused!

What's included?

Our "Family Campsite" pass is for two adults and up to four kids. It includes tent space in a campsite, shared with two or three other families, high on the bluff above the St. Croix River. Each family receives two stainless PBMF pint glasses and a gift from REI.

"General Camping" passes are for one adult and up to two children to our family-friendly general camping area. One stainless PBMF pint glass and a gift from REI is included.

Where?

The festival and all festival camping is on Camp St. Croix's North Property (532, County Rd F, Hudson, WI 54016).

From the main concert area, and on foot, the general camping area is two minutes away and the family sites are five minutes away.

Arrival and departure?

The camping areas open at noon on September 17. All campers will be asked to leave by noon on September 18.

Assigned locations?

In the family camping sites families will be assigned a specific 12x12 tent area in one of several large wooded sites, each shared with two or three other families. Each site has a fire pit and picnic table.

In the general camping area individuals may choose where they wish to set up their tent in a large field. There will be an area with fire pits and picnic tables and individuals may choose how close to that area they wish to be.

Tents or vehicles?

All camping is primitive/tent-only.

Parking?

REI will help campers unload their cars near the camping area, then point them to park in the general festival parking area (which is immediately next to the main concert area).

Prohibited items?

Outside food and beverage (no glass containers) are permitted on camp property in "camping areas". No outside food or beverage (except water) is allowed in "concert areas."

See general FAQ for generally prohibited items.

Wristbands and re-entry?

Campers will be given a camping wrist band upon arrival and can leave and re-enter if desired. All non-campers will be asked to leave camp property immediately following the final music set.

Bathrooms and showers?

No showers will be available. Porta-potties will be available for all and modern restrooms will be available for parents with infants.

Breakfast?

All campers are invited to breakfast, hosted by REI and with coffee from The Roastery, at the Forest Stage Pavilion at 9:00 AM.

Quiet hours?

Campers at PBMF form a relatively small community. While in camping areas all are asked to be cognizant and respectful of their neighbors.
