For three days every spring, participants take on the role of diplomat from another country for three days, forming alliances, learning about issues, and meeting new friends from all over the state.

We will have special features in this year's virtual conference, including focused discussions on current issues, a wide variety of social events, engaging evening activities, time for small-group reflection and chances for recognition.

This won't be like the average school day—it will be filled with engagement and interaction, in sessions led by youth, for youth.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The General Assembly (GA) is the main policymaking area of the United Nations – where all countries are represented. Delegates present and debate their viewpoints in committee and propose solutions to world problems before the entire assembly.

SECURITY COUNCIL

Members of the Security Council maintain international peace and security. The Security Council can impose sanctions or even authorize the use of force for the greater good. Security Council members also resolve crisis situations based on current global issues.

The Human Rights Council (HRC) is responsible for strengthening and protecting human rights around the globe and takes action to address abuses by governments and major organizations.

INTERNATIONAL COURT OF JUSTICE

Major functions of the International Court of Justice (ICJ) are to settle the legal disputes between nations and work to prevent global conflict. ICJ members submit memorials, which are the outline of an argument to bring before the court.

MEDIA

Media participants are responsible for reporting, producing or publishing several stories each day via Newspaper and Digital Media. They interact with all areas of Model United Nations and report their findings to all students and advisors at the conference. SAFETY & SECURITY

Keeping delegates safe online is a high priority. We gather YMCA staff, teachers, and volunteers to coach, support, and supervise students throughout the conference.

- · All volunteers undergo criminal background checks
- Zoom rooms are monitored and protected, with all login information being emailed directly to Delegation Directors and Delegates
- Each delegation conducts group check-in meetings each night

CODE OF CONDUCT & DRESS CODE

YIG programs promote a trust-based Code of Conduct. We expect that all delegates will conduct themselves in a mature and respectful manner. The Code outlines expectations for conduct and possible consequences for not following those expectations.

In our virtual environment, everyone is expected to wear business attire during Program Area time, while during evening activities and other personal time, students are allowed to dress more casually. We don't expect students to buy new clothes to attend Model UN – the dress code has a wide range of what is considered "business" attire.

FAQS FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who runs the program?

Student officers who are elected during the previous program year run Model UN. YMCA staff members, teachers, alumni, and volunteers are always present to guide from the side and help things run effectively. Students are involved in the leadership of Model UN in meaningful and hands-on ways.

How does conference preparation happen?

Local delegation meetings are the place where students write preparation materials for their program area, listen to speakers, and practice their presentation skills.

Where is Model United Nations held?

Online! For the first time ever this year, our Model UN conference will be held virtually utilizing the Zoom virtual meeting platform.

What is included in the conference fee?

Leading up to the conference, the fee contributes towards delegation leadership, content preparation, and published training materials.

Once the conference is underway, it includes access to the three-day virtual experience, sessions led by trained youth Elected Officers and Appointed Officials, and support from adult Program Specialists and YMCA staff.

Why is there a local delegation fee?

Some delegations charge extra fees. These may cover additional resources necessary for recruitment in your community and preparing all delegates for Model UN.

What is the role of adults?

Dedicated adult advisors help each local delegation organize, conduct trainings, raise funds, and prepare for Model United Nations. During the conference, adults are responsible for supervision, safety, and security in Zoom rooms.

HOW TO REGISTER

- Register online at ymcayouthvoice.org
- Work with your Delegation Director to choose a country and the Program Area you wish to be a part of at Model UN. A list of country options is available on our website.
- You may have a different local delegation fee see your Delegation Director for specifics
- The completed registration process will secure your place at Model United Nations.

PAYMENTS AND CANCELLATIONS

- \$75 online conference fee Due at registration
- Cancellations may be made until March 12, when all fees and rosters are final.
- Cancellations must be in writing and are submitted to your local Delegation Director.
- If a delegate has a significant discipline issue or violation of the Code of Conduct, we reserve the right to dismiss the delegate, without refund, for the remainder of the session.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

- The YMCA Center for Youth Voice is committed to providing access to all who wish to participate in our programs. Need-based financial assistance is available giving those who are eligible up to 40% off. The YMCA raises funds through the Annual Fund to help make that possible. Financial Assistance is granted on first-come, first-served basis. Apply via our website by March 12. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- Some requesting Financial Assistance may not be able to complete their registrations online. Please check with your Delegation Director for more information.

ACCESSIBILITY

Students with disabilities requiring an accommodation or some special needs program leaders should be aware of, please contact the local Delegation Director. The Delegation Director will work with the State Office related to the request. This information enables us to better meet the needs of students within available resources.
