Purpose:

To support the Icaghowan Community Board in completing their charts of work, advancing the mission of the Y in the community, and represent the Y in the community.

Specific Duties:

- Provide a youth perspective for the Community Board
- Ask questions and challenge ideas around how the YMCA serves youth
- Bring innovative ideas to all aspects of Y programs and services
- Monitor strategic goals pertaining to youth for the organization
- Represent the organization at functions and meetings and acting as a spokesperson as appropriate

Youth Board Member Duties:

- 1. Attend board and committee meetings regularly.
- 2. Ask discerning questions and constructively participate in discussions
- 3. Assume leadership of board groups and events as requested.
- 5. Work in areas where your background and interests would be of value.
- 6. Actively participate in the annual giving program.
- 7. Familiarize yourself with the YMCA's mission, programs, and core values.
- 8. Advocate for the YMCA in the community.

Effect on End Result:

The benefits of having young people on boards are threefold: Boards benefit from the broad range of skills, backgrounds and new perspectives provided by young people. Young people learn about decision-making, using their voice for positive change, community awareness and connectedness and local decision-making. They also gain a sense of their individual strengths and how to use those strengths in different settings.
