## RESOLUTION

The General Assembly,

<u>Recognizing</u> the controversial nature of mining, including potential negative environmental impacts, beneficial economic growth, and prosperity for all Minnesota citizens,

<u>Acknowledging</u> that the development of mining in northern Minnesota will have widespread economic benefits in all parts of the state, <u>Aware</u> of the potential consequences of sulfide mining, including but not limited to: unwanted water and chemical runoff, harm of the fragile BWCA ecosystem, and undelivered economic benefits,

- 1. <u>Affirms</u> current approval processes for sulfide mines in the state of Minnesota,
- Recommends that companies interested in pursuing sulfide mining projects front a financial package that covers potential damage costs, negative community impacts, and exit strategies,
- 3. <u>Directs</u> the creation of a technical council that consists of representatives from companies that are developing mine projects, Minnesota state citizens, and non-profit organization/environmental conservation representatives, with the goal of promoting integrity and oversight into protecting the environment while ensuring economic benefit and prosperity,
- 4. <u>Further proclaims</u> that a majority of those employed with such projects be from the local community, so as to encourage the goal of maximum local and community benefit,
- 5. <u>Observes</u> the premier nature of the state's regulations on mining, the option of variances shall be forbidden in regard to all environmental impacts and opportunities for community input.
