SOCIAL INNOVATION AND LEADERSHIP INTERNSHIP INFORMATION

You are invited to apply to the inaugural year of the Social Innovation and Leadership Program. The Social Innovation and Leadership Program (SILI) is a **four-month long, 50-hour, paid internship** that focuses on **leadership, social innovation, and youth-lead change**. The program begins with a two and a half day-long training (not overnight) at ImpactLives in St Louis Park in mid-late January. The interns then spend time in local YMCAs conducting community-needs assessment through volunteering and spending time with key community members. The internship culminates with interns developing a small-project for social change based on their research.

INTERNSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

- This internship consists of a two and a half day long training session at ImpactLives and four site visits to a YMCA after-school program.
- The hours spent should not exceed 30 hours actively participating in training, volunteering, and needs assessment and 20 hours of independent preparation/planning.
- Interns are responsible for:
 - o Completing assignments prior to training
 - Attending Leadership training at Impact Lives (Mid-late Jan)
 - Conducting guided community-needs assessment at local YMCA (Blaisdell or West St. Paul)
 - Creating and executing a small-scale innovation project based on needs of community
 - Participating in small-group huddles with other interns throughout workshop series

QUALIFICATIONS

- Currently enrolled at a college or university
- Interested in pursuing a career related to youth-work, social innovation, education, social advocacy, non-profit work
- Ability to work independently and strategically
- Extremely dependable and able to work/communicate professionally
- Committed to developing self as a leader, willing to go above and beyond what is required

- Interns in partner schools receive specialized leadership development training and a service learning experience.
